Outstanding, among the short-term sightings of the season, were <u>Alex Katz</u>'s big, dark, deep landscapes at Gavin Brown's Enterprise; <u>William Powhida</u>'s exquisitely incisive, connect-thedots dissections of art and politics (including the Kanders affair) at Postmasters; and a <u>David Hammons</u> solo at Hauser & Wirth in Los Angeles which, blocks away from one of the country's largest urban homeless encampments, included its own tent city.
